



MVA Reform

Major changes:

April 1, 2019

- Cap on non-pecuniary damages
- CRT jurisdiction up to \$50,000
- Limits on expert evidence
- Constitutional challenge

May 1, 2021

- Tort ban
- Enhanced care (no fault)



Enhanced Accident Benefits



Available to an injured driver, pedestrian, or cyclist regardless of fault for the accident

Enhanced Accident Benefits Include




- Medical and rehabilitation benefits (physiotherapy, chiropractor, massage, dental care, counselling, assistance with daily living activities, accessibility renovations, medical equipment)
- Income replacement (including supports for students and minors)
- Caregiving expenses
- Permanent impairment compensation
- Death and funeral benefits



The CRT is not part of the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC) or any other auto insurer.

What you should know about a medical opinion You might need a medical opinion to show the insurer and the CRT what your injuries are from the motor vehicle accident. Health care professionals that treat you for your injuries can provide a medical opinion. Health care providers can only provide their opinion. They can't decide whether an injury is a "minor injury", or how much you should claim for damages.

How to get a medical opinion

If you don't have a family doctor, visit a walk-in clinic. If it's a medical emergency, go to your nearest hospital or call 911 for an ambulance.

During the visit, tell the provider what your medical issues are as a result of the accident. Be as complete and accurate as possible. The provider may take a medical



Pain and suffering \$	You suffered physical pain and emotional distress as a result of the accident. If the CRT decides your injury is a "minor injury", this amount is capped at \$5,500 from April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020, and \$5,627	You could review past CRT and court decisions to see what was awarded in similar circumstances You may want to get professional advice.

Enforcement and Judicial Review

- Orders can be filed in court and enforced
- Decisions are subject to judicial review
 - Standard of review for CRT decisions is prescribed, generally very deferential
 - Typical remedy is to set aside the decision and remit back to the decision-maker



- Getting too attached to one way of doing things
- Wanting technology to do everything
- Guessing about user preferences
- Fear of failure
- Letting the perfect be the enemy of the good



Current challenges

- COVID-19 effects
 - Hiring and retention
 - Increased dispute volumes across all areas of jurisdiction
- Influx of motor vehicle claims after constitutional challenge decision
 - New process for lawyers
 - Delays obtaining evidence
