About the Injuries Board

The Injuries Board is the independent statutory body which makes personal injury compensation awards arising from motor, workplace and public liability accidents. The Board is self-funded predominantly through fees charged to those who are responsible for injuries (or their insurers) arising from such accidents.

Awards continue to be delivered faster and more cost effectively than the previous litigation based system. The Injuries Board model has to date delivered direct and indirect savings of approximately €1billion to the economy.

By law, personal injury claims (with some minor exclusions) must come to the Injuries Board for assessment regardless of whether the claimant has legal representation or not. Direct claimants can have their claim assessed for a refundable fee of €45. In assessing claims the Board makes no distinction between a direct applicant and a claimant with representation who can typically pay an intermediary the equivalent of up to 10% or more of the value of their award. An Order to Pay, issued by the Injuries Board is legally binding and has the same effect as an award of Court. During 2013, the self-funding Injuries Board made its highest ever compensation award of €1.39m at a delivery cost of €6,000, or 0.5%. There is no cap on the level of damages awards that the Board can make.
